The Roosevelt Elementary School Site Council sincerely appreciates the support of the City of Scottsbluff and Scottsbluff School Board to work collaboratively in support of crossing guards for our school attendance site. The Roosevelt Site Council conducted a walkthrough of the block surrounding the school and is making the following recommendations:

- 1) The 15 mph speed zone signage needs to be posted on the immediate walking blocks surrounding the school. There is no signage posted for these blocks (all directions). Police department needs to enforce this speed limit.
- 2) A suggestion would be to have the signage for the pedestrian walkways flashing at all crossing points during school hours and utilize a sign color which calls alert to the area.
- 3) The intersection of 9<sup>th</sup> and Overland needs to be a point of review. Children and drivers crossing the 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue point using the crosswalk cannot see the traffic sign.
- 4) The Scottsbluff Police Department needs to warn drivers or cite for violation those individuals who are not adhering to the red zone areas in the vicinity of the school.
- 5) The playground is a drug free zone. The council recommends additional support from the police department because of the use of drugs on the playground after hours and weekends by older individuals who do not attend elementary school. There is a highly visible use of alcohol and tobacco in the basketball games and soccer games held in the evening hours.
