Students completing the Agribusiness Pathway will be prepared for entry level employment or certifications, diploma, or degree programs through regional community colleges or four year institutions. While in the academy, students will learn concepts pertaining to sales and marketing, management and leadership, livestock purchasing, finances, and distribution. Students will have the opportunity to work with industry professionals and take college courses in preparation for post-secondary studies. Students will have the choice to participate in FFA and have the opportunity to attend regional, state, and national competitions pertaining to their content area.
